# **Healthy Hope Camp:**

providing educational outdoor experiences to area children

ighteen children between the ages of seven and 11 attended Healthy Hope Camp, a weeklong therapeutic summer day camp held July 19 through 23 under the guidance and direction of **Nancy Reed** and **Lauren Anderson**. Healthy Hope Camp 2010 follows a successful summer camp held in 2009. Funded through a seed grant, ten children with mental health needs from within the Mercy Behavioral Health system participated. The camps have been highly successful.

Healthy Hope Camp is held at **Camp Guyasuta**, located in Sharpsburg, Pa. The camp is owned and operated by the Boy Scouts of America, Greater Pittsburgh Council, which makes the camp available to other organizations.

The children who attended Healthy Hope Camp attend public school through the school year with special support services and receive additional outside mental health services from Mercy Behavioral Health. At the camp, the children experienced group psycho-socialization activities as well as psycho-educational programming. They learned coping skills as they gained mastery of issues that hamper their ability to integrate more successfully into mainstream society.
